Pursuant to the Texas Public Information Act, I am requesting records related to the 2026 investigation into the disappearance and presumed death of Rebecca “Becky” Beard and information provided in 2026 by witness Cherie Lynette Starr, also known as “Rio.”

Please provide records created or received during 2026 concerning:

1. Interviews, statements, reports, supplemental reports, recordings, notes, photographs, maps, diagrams, or other materials documenting information provided by Cherie Starr.
2. Records concerning any location identified by Starr as a possible location of Rebecca Beard’s remains or other evidence.
3. Records concerning any proposed search, excavation, or “dig” of a location identified as a result of Starr’s information.
4. Communications, reports, memoranda, or other records discussing whether law enforcement should conduct such a search or excavation.
5. Records discussing the credibility, reliability, corroboration, or verification of information provided by Starr.
6. Records documenting investigative steps taken to corroborate or disprove Starr’s information before any presentation of the matter to a grand jury.
7. Records reflecting communications between the Brazoria County District Attorney’s Office, Brazoria County Sheriff’s Office, Texas Rangers, or any other law-enforcement agency concerning Starr’s information and/or a proposed excavation.
8. Records created independently of the grand jury reflecting the status or disposition of the proposed excavation following any grand-jury presentation.

I understand that Texas law protects the secrecy of grand-jury proceedings. I am NOT requesting grand-jury testimony, transcripts, deliberations, voting records, juror identities, or other records maintained solely within the actual or constructive possession of the grand jury.

This request specifically seeks records independently created, obtained, or maintained by the District Attorney’s Office and/or investigating law-enforcement agencies in their own capacities, including records that existed before being provided or presented to a grand jury.

If a responsive record was independently created or maintained by your office or another investigative agency and was subsequently presented to a grand jury, please do not treat the mere presentation of that independently maintained record to the grand jury as making the agency’s independently maintained copy a grand-jury record.

If portions of responsive records are confidential, please redact those portions and release all reasonably segregable public information.

Electronic copies are preferred.
